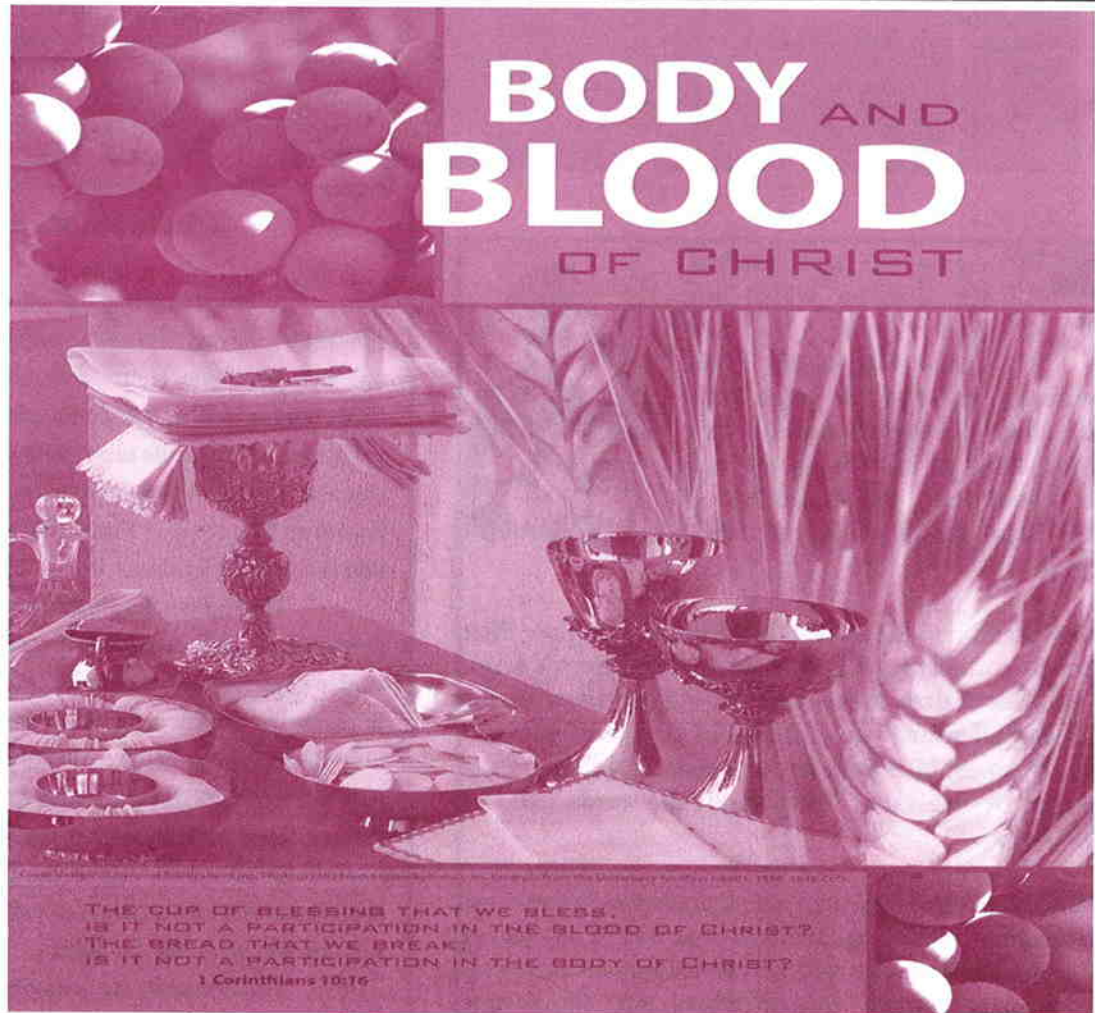



Body and Blood of Christ


A dear friend had battled weight problems all of his life. He tried every diet ever concocted, each ending quickly and with no results. He lived an admittedly sedentary lifestyle, but blamed his weight on bad genes and bad luck. Finally in desperation he underwent gastric bypass surgery and lost a great deal of weight very quickly. While he is thinner, he can no longer enjoy food as he once did. He replaced one depression with another.

Throughout his earthly ministry, Jesus promised us great things, such as eternal life and the Holy Spirit to guide us. He promised us comfort and nourishment for all of our lives, and in exchange for these things, he only asked that we believe in God and love one another. Not a bad deal at all! But realizing the pressures we would be under from an unbelieving world, he asked us to remember him also with a very special meal, the Eucharist.



The Eucharist is a sacrifice of thanksgiving to the Father, a blessing by which the Church expresses her gratitude to God for all his benefits, for all that he has accomplished through creation, redemption, and sanctification. Eucharist means first of all "thanksgiving" (CCC 1360).
