**The Most Holy Trinity**

Scientists at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine in New York released a study about a year ago in which they were sure they could identify the particular part of the brain that controls the feeling of love. 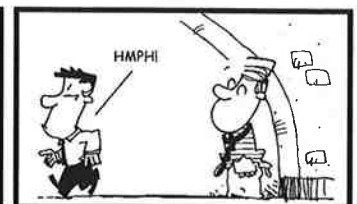

But take a moment and study those six words; realize how much God loves us, and then think about how great that love is when God is willing to allow his only son to die for us and our sins.

And through that death and resurrection God gives to us the completion of the Holy Trinity, the most central mystery of the Christian faith and Christian life (CCC 261). God truly wants only happiness for us; his love is not an exclusionary love meant for only a few, but for us all.
